
One of Jacob's 12 sons was Joseph, who through strange circumstances brought his Israelite family to Egypt

After Solomon, a civil war divided the nation into the Northern Kingdom, called Israel, and the Southern Kingdom, called Judah.






Israel in the north had 19 kings who were all bad and was exiled to Assyria, never to return until modern times (1948)




